

About DBC...

Dorion Bible Camp is one of *CSSM Ministries* 44 camps across Canada. Located just east of Thunder Bay, the camp is nestled on the shore of Black Bay. Currently the camp has 2 properties on Bible Camp Rd. The original (east) 20 acre property has been in use since 1946 and has the camper cabins, wash houses, dining hall, chapel, sports court, volleyball court, field, archery range, various staff cabins and office. The west property was purchased in the mid 80's. This property is 120 acres with a 11 bedroom lodge that sleeps 30, 2 staff houses, the winter office, hiking trails, our 4-sided climbing tower with zip line, cold water creek, and room for future development.

We get campers primarily from Thunder Bay, but we cover the north shore with campers coming from as far as Marathon. The majority of our campers are from a non-churched background. The trend in recent years is that many of our campers who come have never heard the gospel message, or anything about the Bible at all. Our goal is to present Christ to every camper who comes—keeping in line with the mission of *CSSM Ministries* of “...**presenting the Gospel to those having least opportunity to hear of Christ, especially children and youth...**”

People who are a part of our staff team are part of impacting lives. Campers who come here are challenged and encouraged to explore the Bible and the claims of Christ. Many leave here with the beginnings of a relationship with Christ and a fantastic journey with Him. We make a difference here.

WATERFRONT

There are a number of governmental in industry standards that must be kept as we run our waterfront. To be a part of our waterfront crew the requirements are:

Waterfront Director

Needs to be at least 18 years old, experienced, and certified with a current NLS pool or waterfront option. The WFD oversees the running of the waterfront and the lifeguards ensuring that we are running our waterfront according to regulations.

Lifeguards

Must be at least 16 years old and hold a current Bronze Cross or equivalent. Between the WFD and the lifeguards, we need at least 3 people supervising between 26-100 campers.

Do I Get Paid?

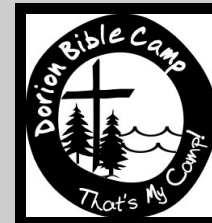
All of our summer positions are volunteer, however, there is opportunity to raise support through *CSSM Ministries*' **S.W.A.P.P. Summer Work And Partnership Program** is a means for summer volunteers to be able to raise support for their missionary service in the summer (must work a minimum of 3 weeks to qualify). Basically the program works by the summer missionary having friends, family and church family support them financially during their time at camp. The donations are sent in to *CSSM Ministries* on your behalf and *CSSM Ministries* issues a charitable receipt to the donor. CABIN STAFF

Cabin Staff are the 'front line' staff with the campers. In many ways this is one of the more rewarding positions as well as one of the more challenging ones. As part of the cabin leading team, you will have opportunity to care for a group of campers each week, teach skill activities, participate in chapel times/music, campfires, and make camp fun for kids. There are 3 cabin staff roles here at DBC

1. **Head Cabin Leaders**

In this role, you oversee the cabin staff, set schedules, train, evaluate, help with discipline issues and care for the cabin staff and campers. This person is at least in their early 20's and has the ability to lead others well. We have 1 head cabin leader for the guys and one for the girls.

2. **Cabin Leaders**

Are at least 18 years old and oversee the happenings in the cabin. In this role you would be responsible for the care of the campers in your cabin each week and all that takes place in the cabin and with your campers.

3. **Assistant Cabin Leaders**

Are at least 16 years old and assist the cabin leader with the campers and cabin life.

First Aid

The first Aider must have a current Canadian Red Cross Society or St. John Ambulance Standard 1st Aid Certificate. In this role you would be responsible for overseeing the health aspects of camp, provide first aid as necessary and ensure that campers get their medications on time.

Program Team

Our Program staff are an important part of camp ministry! They are the ones running the games and activities and the exciting events at camp. The team consists of:

Summer Program Director

This person usually at least in their early 20's, is responsible for heading up the program team. They take on setting the schedule for the week, organizing and overseeing the various aspects of the program and the program team. Creativity and organization is a must in this role.

Activity Specialists

Being at least 17, the activity specialists work under the direction of the program director. They are involved in running the activities, camp-wide games, and other program events such as chapels and camp fires. Ideally we would have 4 people in this role.

Maintenance

Maintenance Foreman

Usually at least in their early 20's, the Foreman is responsible for overseeing the maintenance crew. In this role you would have a crew of 4-5 teens and would train and lead them to take on their various tasks.

Maintenance Crew

Those who are at least 13 can be a part of this team. As a part of this crew you would be involved in various maintenance tasks at camp like grass cutting, wood splitting, cleaning, lighting camp fires and any other maintenance tasks that come up each week. As part of this team, you would need to have steel toe work shoe/boots, work gloves and protective eyewear.

Kitchen

DBC has a great reputation for good, quality meals and a well run kitchen. This aspect of camp ministry is integral as well fed campers can better enjoy the rest of their camp experience.

Head Cook

Oversees the food and cooking aspect of the kitchen. Menu planning, scheduling, and good timing are all involved here. The head cook is responsible for the assistant cooks in the kitchen.

Cooks

As a cook, you don't necessarily need to know recipes or how to run a kitchen. In this role you would need to be able to follow the instructions of the head cook and work well as a part of a team.

Head Hospitality Hostess

The HHH is the one who oversees and manages the hospitality crew. There would be scheduling and teaching that happens in this role as you oversee a team of between 3-5 people. The HHH must be at least 18

Hospitality Crew

Those who are at least 13 can be a part of this team. As a HH you would be involved in bringing meals to the tables, collecting and washing dishes, cleaning the dining hall and kitchen. There is also opportunity to help with camp-wide games

Dishwasher

The dishwasher does just that—wash dishes. In this role you would work with the Hospitality Crew to wash the dishes after each meal. The dishwasher is responsible for keeping the dish washing area and the kitchen floors clean.

OFFICE

The office is the hub of camp and requires a person to be there to answer the phone, greet visitors, do various office/secretarial tasks and run the tuk shop. This person should have good people skills, be organized, and good math skills
